NOTICE OF TECHNICAL WORKSHOP

Take notice that Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission) staff will convene a technical workshop to discuss the functionality and features of the relational database through which the Commission will begin collecting certain market-based rate (MBR) information in accordance with Order No. 860 (MBR Database).¹ This workshop provides a forum for dialogue between Commission staff and interested entities to discuss the general features of the MBR Database and the process for submitting information into this database.
